Dear Friends,

2020 challenged us with a global pandemic, natural disasters, a movement to address racism and inequalities, and an overall feeling of anxiety in facing the unknown. 2020 CORE PROGRAMS

PATH TO SUCCESS LEADERSHIP PROGRAM

Thanks to our donor-sponsors, 23 students from junior high through university benefited from financial support for their education, internet access, practical training on topics relevant to their lives, mentorship, and participation in community development activities.

Students learn to document their experiences in writing as well as through photography and other media.

Despite the lock-down, students further developed academic and workplace skills including finance, health, global issues, and creativity.





CREATIVE ARTS CLASSES

At the start of 2020, Pagus began teaching Creative Arts classes at two community schools: Wayanu and Agbokorpe.

Ghana Education Service tasked our team with developing lessons aligned with the national curriculum and delivering classes twice a week to primary school children. These classes helped build skills and confidence as students had a creative outlet in a supportive environment.

EDUCATION BY THE HOUSEHOLD

During COVID we transitioned from teaching children in the rural communities by skill or grade level to grouping them according to household bubble.

Our Path to Success student-teachers and staff learned new classroom management techniques to help them in this unique environment.

COMMUNITY YOUTH CLUBS

From pre-school to junior high school, students in rural communities were eager to take part in free and fun activities offered by Pagus:Africa.

Path to Success students organized youth clubs to creatively engage younger children after school. They plan activities that help children learn and grow to become strong, happy, and healthy members of their communities.



YOUTH DEVELOPMENT CLUBS

Club members select topics and activities that interest them. This helps instill ownership and empowerment. One of the topics that we discussed was responsibilities of youth in the community and how gender was reflected in those responsibilities.

LITERACY CLUBS

Literacy clubs bridge the gap between the students' desire to excel at reading and what is provided in the classroom.

Our program uses phonics and fun activities like Reader's Theater to build understanding and a passion for reading.

ON MY PATH TO SUCCESS

I joined the Path to Success student internship program in September 2019. I was a high school graduate that had a dream of becoming a diplomat, but I needed support and help to build my skills.

My goal was to be able to influence a group of people without worrying about how large the crowd would be. Initially, I had very low confidence – I could not feel my face when talking to a single elderly person or even look people in the eye!

As part of my path to success I was required to write essays and take photos and videos. All this helped me figure out what I wanted to say to others. The staff took time to correct my mistakes so I could develop my skills and become a powerful speaker.

My experience has allowed me to facilitate sessions during club meetings; I join my colleagues to share ideas, and I regularly give presentations. All these contribute to my public speaking skills and my newfound comfort sharing my ideas among people.


FOCUSING RESOURCES

Our budget for income generation fell short of our goal, but reductions in spending due to school closures and staff reduction offset that loss and helped us to reach our goal for financial sustainability.


INCOME 2020

Pagus Center for Achievement Campus


The move to the Pagus Center for Achievement campus, purchased in 2018, was delayed by COVID. As of December 2020, work resumed on the renovation and a new move-in date is on track for May 2021. The new Center will provide space for our students to work safely at a social distance and after the pandemic, will be able to accommodate as many as 35 students.


2021 Goals
